“Share the Journey” Campaign

“EVERYONE HAS A LITTLE MIGRANT IN THEIR SOUL”

“There’s a little bit of migrant in everyone”, Cardinal Luis Antonio Tagle of Manila, Philippines, said during a U.S. visit in February, at the 75th anniversary observance of the U.S. bishops’ overseas humanitarian relief and development agency. “The story of human history is one based on people moving around the planet in search of a better life and it is humanity’s responsibility - and the church’s - to welcome travelers and meet their needs. To ignore the needs of another person is to ignore the needs of a brother or sister. And by understanding that each person, especially those who are migrants or forcibly displaced from their homeland, is on a journey to God, then perhaps the barriers that keep people separated from each other can be overcome. Our basic contribution as church is to put the human face on the person and help share their journey to hope, security and freedom- as we are doing with the two-year Share the Journey campaign of Caritas Internationalis. The campaign, introduced in September by Pope Francis, invites people of faith to interact with and welcome migrants and forcibly displaced people who are struggling to survive in the face of economic and social oppression, war and criminal violence. The Share the Journey campaign is really to develop a culture of personal encounter. Hear their stories and then discover their humanity. To discover their humanity is to discover your own humanity, how they are just like us.”

FAMILY CONNECTION

The Ascension of the Lord

It can be very important whom we sit next to. Any family that has tried to sit down to a family dinner or packed the car for a trip has heard children argue at least once about who should sit where. To sit next to someone, especially if that person is important, is to have a place of honor. Jesus has this place of honor seated at God the Father's right hand, but there's more to this metaphor than where Jesus sits in relation to the Father. To be in the place of honor is also to be in a place of power. Knowing people in powerful places can be helpful. Our children remind us of this each time we are called upon to referee a conflict. Jesus, honored at the Father's right hand, is a powerful ally for us.



As you gather as a family, talk about why it might be important to a person to sit in a particular place. In today's Gospel we learned about Jesus' place in heaven. Read it together--Mark 16:15-20. Discuss the relationship shown between the Father and Son and what we learned about Jesus' relationship to us. Point out that Jesus continues to help us from this place of honor in heaven.
