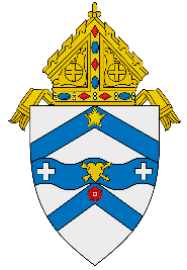

Gospel Meditation

Today's readings speak to us about our relationship with God and our relationship to the things and people of this world. In the Gospel we read where the Pharisees are trying to trap Jesus in what He is teaching, but, Jesus is too clever to be caught by the trap they have set. He says that we are to give "to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God." We are made by and for God and we belong to God. Our first obligation is to Him. We should still fulfill our worldly obligations and be faithful to them as well, as long as they do not conflict with our obligations to God. We learn that we belong to God and we are to give our full allegiance to Him. In other words we are to give Him our very selves.
