Feast of Christ the King

This passage from Matthew might be considered a list of essential duties for a follower of Christ. The Gospel points out that Jesus speaks about the "nations" who gather, so we can see this as both an individual and communal response to God. As individuals and as a community, are we able to see Christ in the needy, the least, the poorest and the forgotten? Our yes, to accepting the Kingdom depends on our willingness to see and respond to them as we would to Christ.

HOW IT'S MADE: CATHOLIC VOCATIONS

Every vocation involves a serious, life-long commitment for the good of the individual and the growth of the Church. It is a celebration of *new lives!* A vocation "roots" a person into a specific life: a way to grow in holiness and help others do the same.

- **Holy Marriage.** How it's made: The free consent of a man and woman through exchange of vows, and the consummation of the marriage. Purpose: A lifelong partnership for the good of the spouses and the raising up of children in the Faith.
- **Holy Orders:** How it's made: The bishops prayer of consecration as he lays his hands on the man being ordained. Purpose: To preach the gospel of Jesus Christ and bring the sacraments to the faithful.
- **Religious Life.** How it's made: The public vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience in a stable state of life recognized by the Church. Purpose: Total dedication to God in order to serve the Church, be examples of holiness, and pray for the salvation of the world.

"Share the Journey" Campaign

The church's position on migration is rooted in the Gospel and in the rich tradition of Catholic social teaching. A recent example of this teaching is in *Strangers No Longer:*

Together on the Journey of Hope, a joint pastoral letter concerning migration from the Catholic Bishops of Mexico and the U.S. The pastoral letter promotes five principles that should be used to help formulate migration related policy.

Principle Three (Principle two can be found in last week's bulletin) Sovereign nations have the right to control their borders. The church recognizes the right of sovereign nations to control their territories and their borders. However, wealthier nations, which have the ability to better protect and feed their residents, have a strong obligation to accommodate migration flows.

JESUS CHRIST THE KING

November 26

Pope Pius XI instituted The Feast of Christ the King in 1925 for the universal church, in his encyclical *Quas Primas*. He connected the increasing denial of Christ as king to the rise of secularism throughout much of Europe. At the time of *Quas Primas*, many Christians

began to doubt Christ's authority and existence, as well as the Church's power to continue Christ's authority.

It is fitting that the feast celebrating Christ's kingship is observed right before Advent, when we liturgically wait for the promised Messiah (King). Jesus knew the oppressive nature of secular kings, and in contrast to them, he connected his role as king to humble service, and commanded his followers to be servants as well. While Christ is coming to judge the nations, his teachings spell out a kingdom of justice and judgment balanced with radical love, mercy, peace, and forgiveness. When we celebrate Christ as King, we are not celebrating an oppressive ruler, but one willing to die for humanity and whose "loving-kindness endures forever."
