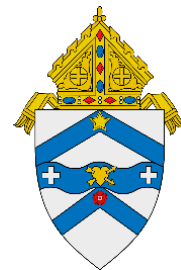

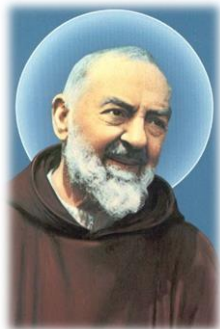

**St. Pio of Pietrelcina**

Saturday, September 23  
**“Padre Pio”**



Born in southern Italy, St. Pio took no time at all to join the Capuchin Franciscans. He was only 15 when he joined the Capuchins and several years later, he was ordained. In 1918, Padre Pio had a vision of Jesus and was left with the stigmata (Jesus’ wounds) on his hands, feet and side. After this, he would rarely leave the friar due to the large crowds that came to catch a glimpse of him. When he heard confessions, it would sometimes take up to ten hours a day. On another occasion, Padre Pio had a vision of Jesus sick and suffering, which encouraged Padre Pio to build a hospital on a mountain nearby. On September 23, 1968 he died and in 2002, he was canonized.
