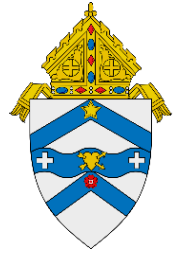

June 25-26, 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time

This Sunday we begin with Jesus on the great journey to Jerusalem. Having told the disciples that commitment to him would mean the cross, Jesus does not waver from his path. As Elijah clothed Elisha with his prophetic mantle, Jesus has clothed us in the mantle of discipleship. We are invited to follow and to avoid excuses and distractions. In the second reading, St. Paul points to the heart of our discipleship – to love one another in the freedom given to us by Christ. What might distract us from loving fully?

FEAST OF STS. PETER AND PAUL

June 29

St. Peter was a Galilean, an uneducated fisherman, bold and impulsive. St. Paul was a highly educated Roman from Tarsus, a scholarly Pharisee who taught himself tent-making so as to not be a financial burden on the Church after his conversion to Christianity. Peter was a natural leader, and despite his shortcomings—or because of them—he was selected by Jesus to be the first pope in Rome and the visible head of the early Church. Paul didn't know Jesus during his time on earth, but Jesus appeared to him and inspired his conversion. Paul was the Apostle to the Gentiles, traveling the known world by land and sea to make converts.

In the Book of Acts, a dispute broke out about whether or not a Gentile who wanted to be Christian needed first to become a Jew and be circumcised. Although Peter and Paul disagreed about the issue, they eventually worked out their differences face to face (Acts 10:9-16). The dispute is an inspiring example of working through important disagreements in a charitable and productive way.

Peter and Paul are now remembered together as the foundation of the Catholic Church. Tradition holds that they were both martyred in Rome on June 29. St. Peter in the year 64 by being crucified upside down. St. Paul by beheading three years later.
